who has spoken through the Prophets.

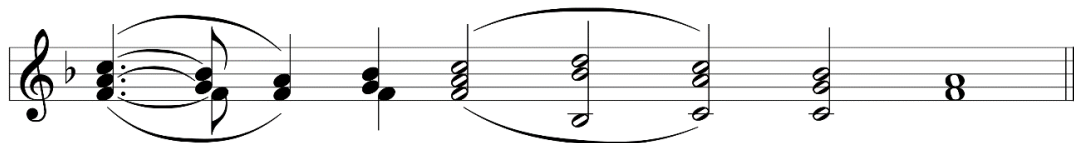
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
