

<sup>9</sup>The LORD shall reign forever, \* your God, O Zion, throughout all generations. Hallelujah!



# **THE SERMON** — The Very Rev. Lewis D. Crusoe, Rector

### THE CREED (BCP p. 358)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father. and the Son.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.


We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

Presider: The Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ keep you in everlasting





After Communion, the Celebrant says. The people stand.


