Presider: The Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ keep you in everlasting life.

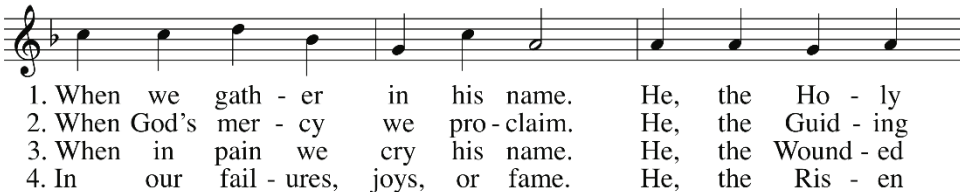


